Children and young people worried about their own mental health, an adult worried about a child or young person's mental health or a professional, with consent, can contact our single point of contact phone line.

You can call to talk to a mental health nurse about your concerns.

Child and Adolescent Mental Health Services Crisis Team

This team offer 24/7 support for children/young people in mental health crisis.

The team respond to the immediate mental health needs of young people, offering short term help, either at home or in the community, and will stay involved until there is a resolution of the immediate crisis.

When to call?

- If a young person is suicidal or has self-harmed.
- If a young person is experiencing extreme emotional distress that won't stop.
- If a young person is experiencing sudden or severe anxiety which is preventing them getting on with their normal life.
- If a young person is in extreme emotional distress and would like to speak to someone.
- If anyone needs urgent advice about a young person's mental health.

The team can: complete urgent mental health and risk assessments; offer advice and support about how to cope in a crisis; help the young person and carers make plans to keep a young person safe and develop plans to offer ongoing support as and when required. However they are unable to: provide medication; physically restrain a young person or provide accommodation.

Feeling like you can't cope?

We know that it's scary when you don't know if you'll be able to buy food or pay your next bill. If you're feeling anxious, depressed, or like you've run out of options, please reach out for help.

The Tees, Esk and Wear Valleys crisis service is open 24 hours a day, seven days a week. They will listen without judging you, support you, and help you with what to do next.

You can call them on **0800 0516 171**, for free. Please don't suffer alone.

Alternatively, in a mental health crisis, call **NHS 111** and select the **mental health option (2)**. You will be able to speak to a mental health professional who can listen to you and help you find the right support.

YOUNG MINDS

Although it's often amazing and rewarding to watch your children or young people grow up, it can also be really hard work. Things might feel especially difficult if your child or young person is struggling with their mental health, or if their mood and behaviour seem different, and you're not sure why or what you can do to help. But you are not alone.

Youngminds have lots of practical advice to help you support them – from encouraging them to open up, to navigating mental health services and finding them the right help. No matter what you're going through, things can get better

Important
