Only Y5 and Y6 pupils who have signed permission are allowed to leave the school premises by themselves at the end of the school day. Poor behaviour may result in this permission being removed.

#### Y4 Girls Cricket.

The Y4 Girls Team played well in the rain and came third. Brilliant Bronze medals for these budding cricketers.

#### **Y6 Cricket Plate**

On Thursday 27th June we attended the Middlesbrough Schools Y6 Cricket Plate. We arrived nice and early to get some practise in before being placed in a very difficult group with an opening game v Marton Manor.

Archibald fielded for the first innings and did this pretty well but did not score enough runs and thus lost the game.

Before our second game against Thorntree we discussed how to improve in both our fielding and batting. Despite scoring 20 more runs and reducing the runs conceded by 30 we still narrowly lost by 7 runs.

After lunch we were placed in the green group with Caldicotes and Sunnyside. This time we had the chance to watch our opponents play against each other first and then Mr Coates and Mr Charlton changed around the pairs and batting order to match up with each team's strongest players. In a very exciting game v Caldicotes and thanks to some great catches we won 84-75 before scoring our highest total for the day with 111 runs scored v Sunnyside. As we headed across for the presentations, we were given a round of applause for being the green group winners.





Coincidently, Thorntree also won their afternoon group and Marton Manor were the overall plate winners thus justifying how hard of a group we were placed in for the morning round.

The improvement made throughout the day was exceptional and the behaviour and attitude of all players was exemplary.

Payment is by Bank Transfer, card, debit card or PayPal account.

You can either select 'delivery' and your uniform will be delivered by Royal Mail for a small fee, you can visit the shop to pick your order up for no charge, or you can choose to have your order delivered to school and collect if from the main office. Lollipops will deliver to school on a weekly basis.

Please be aware that there is no requirement to purchase school uniform which includes the school logo. Alternatives without the logo can be purchased from stores and supermarkets online, or in town. Many families choose this option.

All pupils are expected to wear school uniform which instils a sense of belonging and pride. School colours are navy blue and grey.

#### School Uniform

The uniform consists of: -

Navy blue sweatshirt or navy blue cardigan Light blue or white polo shirt or shirt

Grey trousers or skirt

Black shoes or footwear

In warm weather, alternative clothing may be worn: -

Pale blue T shirt/blouse/shirt Blue summer dresses.

Grey or black shorts

#### **PE Kits**

We have a school PE kit consisting of dark blue shorts and a dark blue t shirt which we expect all pupils to wear for PE lessons.

Pupils are encouraged to keep their kit in school, so it is readily available. Plimsolls or trainers are needed for outside PE.

Please be aware that there is no requirement to purchase school uniform or PE kit which includes the school logo.

If you are struggling to provide school uniform for your child, please ask at the office in confidence for support.

#### **Uniform Reminders**

- Denim jeans and tracksuits are not part of our school uniform and should not be worn for school.
- Make up, fake tan, false nails, nail varnish and jewellery must <u>not</u> be worn in school. This includes rings, earrings, bracelets and necklaces. Pupils are not allowed to wear body piercings.
- Pupils who have had their ears pierced may wear small ear studs which prevent the holes closing up again. In these instances, the school can not accept any responsibility for loss or damage to the ear studs, or injury caused to either the wearer or another child or adult resulting from the wearing of the ear studs.
- Pupils wearing nail varnish will be asked to remove it.
- Due to the number of stairs and the fact that children need to be safe whilst in the playgrounds, shoes should be flat or low heeled. 'Strappy' sandals which provide little support should not be worn. Crocs should not be worn for school.
- Sweets and chewing gum are also not allowed in school.

Whilst every reasonable precaution is taken to protect pupil's personal property, neither the school, or its employees can accept any liability for loss or damage to that property, however that loss or damage has come about.
